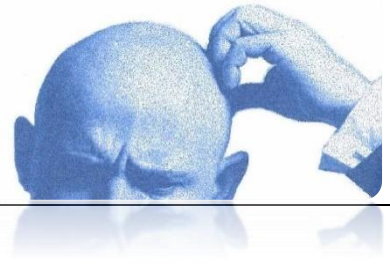


## At the Tomb

# Small Group Questions

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- Read **Luke 24:1-11**. What stands out to you in this text?
- Imagine yourself in this story. How would you have responded to the women returning from the empty tomb?
- In the movie [Horton Hears a Who](#), the mayor tries to convince the residents of Whoville of their reality: *“Horton is a giant elephant in the sky. Don’t bother looking, he’s invisible. And he’s the one risking his life to get Whoville—which, by the way, is a speck on a clover—to safety.”* It is easy to understand why no one believed him. How is this like to believing in the resurrection? How is it different?
- Read **1 Corinthians 1:18-25**. What stands out to you in this text?
- Think of the people living on your street (hopefully you know a few of them). How might they respond to the death and resurrection of Jesus? Why?
- Is there anything we can do to make believing easier for people?
- What difference does the resurrection make for you, living in Calgary in 2022?
- If the resurrection signals the inauguration of the kingdom of God (a time in which God is making all things new), how will that shape your friendships and/or your work?
